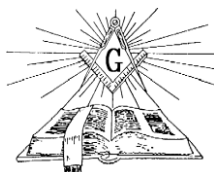

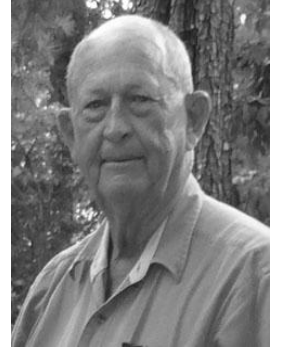
1. Future members are in the community and when the lodge is involved, they will discover what Masonry is all about.
