

My "Challenge to the Brethren" of Webb Lodge is to take the time and get back into the "Habit" of attending lodge. It is necessary that you attend for "Your Lodge" to survive. We need your participation on committees (Scholarship, Visitation, Audit, Education, etc), coaching candidates, giving lectures, filling the chairs, fund raising and the list goes on and on. Those of you who are familiar with the 80/20 rule know that it has been said that 80% of the work is done by 20% of the workers. In Webb Lodge it should be referred to as the 90/10 rule. Brethren you can ask the question, "What has Masonry Done for Me?" when you decide to participate in the various activities of your lodge and contribute. Maybe the question should be "Have I permitted Masonry to help me?" Brethren: take the time, attend lodge, "BE ONE OF THE FAITHFUL FEW!!!!" So mote it be.
