- 7. GROWING YOUR LODGE: Last month WB Huggins brought up the subject of trying to make that extra effort to "Grow Our Lodge." Why is it that several lodges in the area are raising 6-10 candidates every year but Webb Lodge's average is significantly less? We, the members of Webb Lodge need to make an effort, take the time, talk about what we do in our lodge to those non Masons we know who would make a good Mason. A Past Editor of the Masonic Messenger, Fred Lamar Pearson, Jr. wrote an article in the February 2003 Issue and I would like to summarize his article on how to grow a Lodge. The most obvious is to keep the membership numbers in the black, as well as the finances of the lodge. Keep your lodge building and grounds attractive to you and the community (something which hasn't been done for several years). We cannot ask people to join our ranks, but we can act in such a way that some will want to petition our lodge. According to Brother Pearson, one of the most effective tools is a good newsletter. Keep the brethren informed and entertained. Webb Lodge has tried to do this for the past 22 years and have had several positive comments from the membership (and also some criticisms). Experienced Masons can make a difference by responding to a young Mason's questions and taking one of them under his wing. Lodge officers should meet on a regular basis and formulate plans. There should always be Masonic Education, good fellowship and fraternalism at every meeting. Study the opening and closing ceremonies, be proficient in the conferral of degrees and make certain that the coaches know the catechism; not just the words, but more importantly what they mean. Attend the School of Instruction and give the brethren as much responsibility as they can handle. These are some things one might consider to help your lodge. Webb Lodge is on the RIGHT TRACK so far this year, we have a Worshipful Master who I have a lot of faith in and who hopefully has some new ideas, we have a good group of officers, and the membership which attend are very Faithful. We need to continue what we have started throughout the year, keep up our enthusiasm and our Lodge WILL GROW. So mote it be.
- GLOSSARY OF TOOLS: For all you members out there who try to do it all yourself, here are my definitions of specific tools which you might have used in the past: 1. DRILL PRESS: A tall upright machine useful for suddenly snatching flat metal bar stock out of your hands so that it smacks you in the chest and flings your beer across the room. 2. SKILL SAW: A portable cutting tool used to make studs too short. 3. PLIERS: Used to round off bolt heads. Sometimes used in the creation of blood blisters. 4. BELT SANDER: An electric sanding tool commonly used to convert minor touch-up jobs into major refinishing jobs. 5. TABLE SAW: A large stationary power tool commonly used to launch wood projectiles for testing wall integrity. 6. BAND SAW: A large stationary power saw primarily used by most shops to cut good aluminum sheets into smaller pieces that more easily fit into the trash can after you cut on the inside of the line instead of the outside edge. 7. PHILLIPS SCREWDRIVER: Normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper-and-tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt, but can also be used (as the name implies) to strip out Phillips screw heads. 8. STRAIGHT SCREWDRIVER: A tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert common slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms. 9. HAMMER: Originally employed as a weapon of war, the hammer nowadays is used as a kind of divining rod to locate the most expensive parts adjacent to the object you are trying to hit. 10. SON OF A B***H TOOL: Any handy tool that you grab and throw across the garage while yelling "SON OF A B***H!" at the top of your lungs. It is also, most often, the next tool that you will need.
